First Unitarian Universalist Church of San Diego is seeking applications for the position of Handbell Programs Director. Beginning September 2017, the HPD will direct and manage our two Handbell Ensembles – rehearsing each once a week and leading an ensemble in Sunday worship once per month on average. The new HPD will join a music ministry with a long history of excellence and integration into the worship life of the congregation. The Mission of the First Unitarian Universalist Church of San Diego is to create community, to nurture spiritual growth, and to act on our values to help heal the world. As a congregation we are committed to doing the work of racial justice and dismantling racism, both internally and externally. We strive to create opportunities for all to explore and participate in the music ministry of the congregation to the breadth of their abilities and comfort This is a part-time position (approx. 5 hours per week) from September to June with compensation of \$5000 per year. Job Summary

The Handbell Programs Director will lead and direct FUUSD's handbell ensembles. The overall goal of employees of FUUSD is to work to achieve the FUUSD Mission, Strategic Plan, and Music Ministry Vision.

Essential Functions

- Direct and oversee the rehearsal and performances of the Las Campanas and UUBellation ensembles
 - Select and order repertoire appropriate to the skill of the players, the themes of worship, and the needs of non-worship performance/service activities.

- Co-ordinate handbell ensembles' participation in worship with MMWA and the Staff
 Worship Team and inform church office of appropriate information for orders of service.
- Schedule rehearsals and other activities with appropriate office staff and ministers.
- Maintain Handbell music library and coordinate maintenance of appropriate financial records with MMWA.
- Maintain instruments in a manner that ensures their long life and use.

Other Responsibilities

- Attend Staff Worship Team meetings as available, appropriate, and needed to coordinate above activities.
- Track time spent on church work to ensure clear boundaries of work and volunteer efforts.
 Work/effort that is understood to be beyond this job description must be coordinated with MMWA so as to ensure completion of compensated expectations.
- Meet at regularly scheduled times with supervisor to discuss goals, support needed, job performance, and other issues that arise.
- Annually identify personal professional goals and goals for the Handbell Ensembles in line with the Mission of the congregation, its Music Ministry, and the current Strategic Plan.

Principles
