# Mastering Mixed Meter Music 

## Rules of the game:

1. Always count individual eighth notes in $\mathrm{X} / 8$ - and quarter notes in $\mathrm{X} / 4$ - eighth notes are constant (not triplets)

For example: In $7 / 8$ you may count individual beats $(123,45,67)$ or in grouped pulse units $(1+a, 2+, 3+)$
2. Group eighth notes in "families" of 2's, 3's - Use eighth-note beams and context as a guide.
-Beamed eighth notes and longer notes don't usually cross major pulse divisions unless tied or syncopated.
-Lone $8^{\text {th }}$ notes/rests belong to a family - either before d \& \|. . or after . . , . another note These are counted:
3. Feel the shifting pulse - count out loud!! Apply stresses in context (look at both staves.)
4. Every measure starts with "1" - Try tapping the rhythms L\&R; use LH for underlined pulses
5. Spacing doesn't matter - all eighth note beats are equal (no sped-up triplets) (Don't need to count the ( )'s)

E. Now to follow mixed-meter rhythms across staves - always keep the eighth note families in mind. Cross staff beaming keeps "pulse families" together.
