Mastering Mixed Meter Music

We will be ringing from this score, so please print this out and bring it to class!!

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Rules of the game:

<u>1. Always count individual eighth notes in X/8</u> - and quarter notes in X/4 - eighth notes are constant (not triplets) For example: In 7/8 you may count individual beats (123,45,67) or in grouped pulse units (1+a, 2+, 3+)

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2. Group eighth notes in "families" of 2's, 3's - Use eighth-note beams and context as a guide.

-Beamed eighth notes and longer notes don't usually cross major pulse divisions unless tied or syncopated.


-Lone 8^{th} notes/rests belong to a family – either before 1 + a + 1 + 2 + a or after 1 + a + 2 + a another note These are counted: 1 + a + 1 + 2 + a

3. Feel the shifting pulse - count out loud!! Apply stresses in context (look at both staves.)

4. Every measure starts with "1" - Try tapping the rhythms L&R; use LH for underlined pulses

5. Spacing doesn't matter – all eighth note beats are equal (no sped-up triplets) (Don't need to count the ()'s)


Counting common time signatures (identify the single beat unit and the <u>major pulse units</u>)





Some examples of fairly simple Mixed Meter:




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









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D.12 Always count the major pulses, even for rests (m12 b3), but you may skip the off-beat eighths (m13 b1.5)

E. Now to follow mixed-meter rhythms across staves – always keep the eighth note families in mind. Cross staff beaming keeps "pulse families" together.
